- (ii) An amount of RM14,392,000 (30 June 2005: RM5,386,000) which has been set aside to meet or secure the claims of creditors and certain lease payments pursuant to the High Court orders issued in relation to the reduction of capital of the Company.

The condensed consolidated cash flow statement should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2005 and the accompanying explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements.

1. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The interim financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The interim financial statements are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of FRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad.

The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2005. These explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the year ended 31 December 2005.

2. CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2005 except for the adoption of the following new/revised Financial Reporting Standards ("FRS") effective for financial period beginning 1 January 2006:

2. CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTD.)

The adoption of FRS 108, 110, 116, 121, 127, 132 and 133 does not have significant financial impact on the Group. The principal effects of the changes in accounting policies resulting from the adoption of the new/revised FRSs are discussed below:

(a) FRS 2: Share-based Payment

This FRS requires an entity to recognise share-based payment transactions in its financial statements, including transactions with employees or other parties to be settled in cash, other assets, or equity instruments of the entity.

The Company operates an equity-settled, share-based compensation plan for the employees of the Group, the Bursa Malaysia Berhad Employees' Share Option Scheme ("ESOS"). Prior to 1 January 2006, no compensation expense was recognised in profit or loss for share options granted. With the adoption of FRS 2, the compensation expense relating to share options is recognised within staff costs in profit or loss over the vesting periods of the grants with a corresponding increase in equity.

The total amount to be recognised as compensation expense is determined by reference to the fair value of the share options at the date of the grant and the number of share options to be vested by the vesting date. The fair value of the share options is computed using a binomial options pricing model by an external professional valuer. At every balance sheet date, the Group revises its estimates of the number of share options that are expected to vest by the vesting date. Any revision of this estimate is included in profit or loss and a corresponding adjustment to equity over the remaining vesting period.

Under the transitional provisions of FRS 2, this FRS must be applied to share options that were granted after 31 December 2004 and had not yet been vested on 1 January 2006. The application is retrospective and accordingly, the comparative amounts for the period ended 30 June 2005 and as at 31 December 2005 are restated. The financial impact to the Group arising from this change in accounting policy is as follows:

(b) FRS 3: Business Combinations, FRS 136: Impairment of Assets and FRS 138: Intangible Assets

The new FRS 3 has resulted in consequential amendments to two other accounting standards, FRS 136 and FRS 138.

(i) Intangible asset - goodwill

The adoption of these new FRSs has resulted in the Group ceasing annual goodwill amortisation. Goodwill is carried at cost less accumulated impairment losses and is now tested for impairment annually, or more frequently if events or changes in circumstances indicate that it might be impaired. Any impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss and subsequent reversal is not allowed. Prior to 1 January 2006, goodwill was amortised on a straight-line basis over its estimated useful life of twenty (20) years.

The transitional provisions of FRS 3, however, have required the Group to eliminate at 1 January 2006 the carrying amount of the accumulated amortisation of RM14,095,000 against the gross amount of goodwill.

2. CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTD.)

(b) FRS 3: Business Combinations, FRS 136: Impairment of Assets and FRS 138: Intangible Assets (Contd.)

(i) Intangible asset - goodwill (contd.)

The carrying amount of goodwill as at 1 January 2006 of RM44,720,000 ceased to be amortised. This has the effect of reducing the amortisation charges by RM735,000 in the current quarter and RM1,470,000 in the 6 months ended 30 June 2006.

(ii) Intangible assets other than goodwill

Under the new FRS 138, computer software is an intangible asset. Although the application of FRS 138 is prospective, the Group has reclassified the comparative amount for computer software for better presentation. Accordingly, from 1 January 2006, computer software is stated at cost less accumulated amortisation and impairment losses. Its cost is amortised based on its definite life and amortisation is recognised accordingly.

The new FRS 138 requires that the useful lives of intangible assets other than goodwill be assessed at the individual asset level as having either a finite or indefinite life. Some of the intangible assets are regarded to have an indefinite useful life when, based on an analysis of all of the relevant factors, there is no foreseeable limit to the period over which the asset is expected to generate net cash inflows for the Group. Intangible assets with indefinite useful lives are not amortised but instead, are tested for impairment annually. In accordance with the transitional provisions of FRS 138, the change in the useful life assessment from finite to indefinite is made on a prospective basis.

(c) FRS 5: Non-current Assets Held for Sale and Discontinued Operations

The Group has applied FRS 5 prospectively in accordance with its transitional provisions, which has resulted in a change in accounting policy on the recognition of a freehold property as held for sale. Prior to 1 January 2006, under the previous FRS 116, the Group would have recognised the freehold property as property, plant and equipment. FRS 5 requires a non-current asset to be classified as held for sale when the criteria to be classified as held for sale have been met. The result of this change in accounting policy is that a non-current asset held for sale is recognised by the Group at the lower of carrying amount and fair value less costs to sell and has been disclosed as such on the face of the balance sheet.

An item is classified as held for sale if its carrying amount will be recovered principally through a sale transaction rather than through continuing use.

2. CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTD.)

(d) FRS 101: Presentation of Financial Statements

The adoption of the revised FRS 101 has affected the presentation of minority interest, and other disclosures. In the consolidated balance sheet, minority interest is now presented within total equity. In the consolidated income statement, minority interest is presented as an allocation of the net profit or loss for the period. A similar requirement is also applicable to the statement of changes in equity. FRS 101 also requires disclosure, on the face of the statement of changes in equity, total recognised income and expenses for the period, showing separately the amounts attributable to equity holders of the parent and to minority interest.

The current period's presentation of the Group's financial statements is based on the revised requirements of FRS 101, with the comparatives restated to conform with the current period's presentation.

7. SIGNIFICANT ESTIMATES AND CHANGES IN ESTIMATES

The Group makes assumptions concerning the future and other sources of estimation uncertainty at the balance sheet date during its review for impairment of goodwill and depreciation.

The key assumptions and other key sources of estimation uncertainty mentioned above that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are in respect of those made during the review of impairment of goodwill. The Group determines whether goodwill is impaired at least on an annual basis. This requires an estimation of the value-in-use of the cash-generating units to which the goodwill is allocated. Estimating the value-in-use requires the Group to make an estimate of the expected future cash flows from the cash-generating units and also to choose a suitable discount rate in order to calculate the present value of those cash flows. The carrying amount of goodwill at 30 June 2006 was RM44,720,000.

There were no changes in estimates that have had material effect in the current quarter and financial year-to-date results.

18. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

There were no material events subsequent to the end of the current quarter.

19. PERFORMANCE REVIEW

The Group recorded a higher profit before tax of RM43,722,000 for the quarter ended 30 June 2006 compared to RM28,835,000 for the quarter ended 30 June 2005 mainly due to higher operating revenue.

Operating revenue increased by 47.7 per cent to RM69,537,000 for the quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM47,069,000 for the quarter ended 30 June 2005 mainly due to higher trading revenue from the equity market. Trading revenue from both equity and derivatives market increased by 92.6 per cent to RM48,717,000 in the quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM25,294,000 in the quarter ended 30 June 2005. Trading revenue comprised mainly of clearing fee, SCORE fee, derivatives trade fee, ISS fee, guarantee and tender fee, and buying-in commission.

Total clearing and SCORE fees from equity trading doubled to RM38,955,000 for the quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM18,788,000 the quarter ended 30 June 2005. Total trading value (on market and direct business) on Bursa Securities recorded significant improvement at RM73.7 billion (representing daily average trading value of RM1.2 billion) during the quarter ended 30 June 2006 compared to RM46.3 billion (representing daily average trading value of RM0.7 billion) during the quarter ended 30 June 2005. The effective gross clearing fee for on-market trades also improved to 0.0308 per cent from 0.0244 per cent for the corresponding periods.

Trading volume on Bursa Derivatives registered an improvement, resulting in a 57.4 per cent increase in derivatives clearing and trade fee to RM7,093,000 for the quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM4,506,000 for the quarter ended 30 June 2005. Total derivatives contracts traded increased by 52.0% to 899,017 contracts from 591,604 contracts for the corresponding quarters. FKLI trades increased by 59.1 per cent to 420,551 contracts from 264,382 contracts, FCPO trades increased by 32.6 per cent to 383,391 contracts from 289,113 contracts and KLIBOR trades increased by 145.2 per cent to 81,767 contracts from 33,347 contracts in the corresponding quarters.

Stable revenue, which comprised depository services, information services, broker services, listing fee and participants' fee, decreased by 8.5 per cent to RM18,762,000 in the quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM20,506,000 in the quarter ended 30 June 2005. Fees from depository services, the largest contributor to stable income, increased by 8.1 per cent to RM7,025,000 from RM6,497,000 in the previous corresponding quarter. However, revenue from information services and listing fee decreased by 28.0 per cent and 25.8 per cent respectively, to RM4,556,000 and RM2,450,000 respectively, for the quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM6,332,000 and RM3,304,000 respectively, for the quarter ended 30 June 2005. Revenue from information services was higher for the quarter ended 30 June 2005 as fees relating to periods prior to 1 January 2005 was recorded as fees in the quarter ended 30 June 2005 following the finalisation of documentation for the new pricing model which was backdated to 1 October 2004. The lower listing fee was mainly due to lower initial and additional listing fees following lower number of new listings and corporate exercises. There were 10 new listings in the quarter ended 30 June 2006 compared to 16 new listings in the quarter ended 30 June 2005.

19. PERFORMANCE REVIEW (CONTD.)

Other income decreased by 45.7 per cent to RM8,357,000 in the quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM15,380,000 in the quarter ended 30 June 2005 mainly due to lower interest income and a net loss on disposal of investments. Interest income decreased by 31.3 per cent to RM7,889,000 from RM11,476,000 in the corresponding quarters in view of the smaller funds size at Bursa following the capital repayment exercise in December 2005. Disposal of investments resulted in a net loss of RM263,000 from a net gain of RM3,210,000 in the corresponding quarters due to unfavourable market conditions.

Operating expenses increased by 1.3 per cent to RM34,018,000 in the quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM33,580,000 in the quarter ended 30 June 2005.

IT upkeep and maintenance increased by 40.6 per cent to RM4,679,000 from RM3,329,000 in the corresponding quarters due to additional expenses incurred for the maintenance of Bursa Trade hardware. Depreciation increased by 21.6 per cent to RM3,798,000 from RM3,123,000 due to depreciation on new IT equipment such as SAP system, data communication equipment upgrades and back up hardware and software upgrades. Market development and promotion expenses increased by 91.3% to RM853,000 from RM446,000 in line with the group's efforts to enhance quality of markets, and educate and grow investor base.

General administration expenses decreased by 24.6 per cent to RM4,054,000 from RM5,379,000 in the corresponding quarters in line with the group's efforts to pursue financial and operational efficiency. Amortisation of goodwill ceased with effect from 1 January 2006, resulting in a decrease in operating expenses of RM735,000 for the quarter ended 30 June 2005.

Staff costs amounted to RM18,058,000 for the current quarter and remained relatively unchanged compared to the corresponding quarter.

20. MATERIAL CHANGE IN PROFIT BEFORE TAXATION OF CURRENT QUARTER COMPARED WITH PRECEDING OUARTER

The Group's profit before taxation increased by 30.1 per cent to RM43,722,000 for the current quarter ended 30 June 2006 from RM33,617,000 in the preceding quarter ended 31 March 2006. The increase was mainly attributable to higher operating revenue.

Total trading value transacted on the equity market increased by 26.0 per cent to RM73.7 billion in the current quarter compared to RM58.5 billion turnover in the preceding quarter, while the number of contracts traded on derivatives market also increased by 30.1 per cent to 898,093 contracts in the current quarter from 690,472 contracts in the preceding quarter. This resulted in a 19.3 per cent increase in operating revenue to RM69,537,000 during the current quarter from RM58,286,000 in the preceding quarter.

Stable revenue amounted to RM18,762,000 for the current quarter and remained relatively unchanged compared to the preceding quarter.

20. MATERIAL CHANGE IN PROFIT BEFORE TAXATION OF CURRENT QUARTER COMPARED WITH PRECEDING QUARTER (CONTD.)

Other income decreased by 35.5 per cent to RM8,357,000 for the current quarter from RM12,964,000 in the preceding quarter due to lower conference fee and exhibition related income and unfavourable results on disposal of investments.

Total operating expenses also decreased by 9.3 per cent to RM34,018,000 in the current quarter from RM37,509,000 in the preceding quarter, mainly due to lower staff costs and other operating expenses. Staff costs decreased by 2.7 per cent during the current quarter mainly due to lower provision for share-based payment under ESOS amounting to RM809,000 (preceding quarter: RM1,470,000). Other operating expenses was 20.1 per cent lower compared to the preceding quarter mainly due to lower provisions for doubtful debts and other provisions.

21. COMMENTARY ON PROSPECTS

The Group's financial performance will continue to hinge significantly on the level of activities in the securities market in the near term, given that a major portion of the revenue is derived from clearing fee income (about 51.1% of total operating income in the quarter ended 30 June 2006). As such, the Group will continue to focus on efforts to enhance the quality of markets, and grow investor base and market promotion. In relation to quality of markets, the Group will focus on delivering infrastructure improvements, increasing product range on the equity and derivatives markets, enhancing regulatory efficiency and effectiveness and boosting investors' perception of the Malaysian market.

The average daily trading value increased by 22.2 per cent to RM1.1 billion for the financial year-to-date ended 30 June 2006 from RM0.9 billion for the financial year-to-date ended 30 June 2005. Government announcements on further developments for the Malaysian capital market, particularly the reintroduction of regulated short selling ("RSS") and securities borrowing and lending ("SBL"), targeted for third quarter of 2006, had improved investor sentiment though the trading activity since then has decreased due to adverse sentiment on the lower liners. Global events and uncertainties such as the escalating oil prices and the geopolitical development in the Middle East will also weigh in adversely on investor sentiment.

The Group will continue to pursue financial and operational efficiency as part of its corporate strategic objectives. However, IT maintenance costs is expected to increase when Bursa Trade Phase 1a and other IT projects go live in the second half of 2006. Similarly, the corresponding increase in depreciation is expected for the same period upon implementation of Bursa Trade.
